World Patient Safety Day 2025 "Patient Safety From Start - New Born Care"

Invitation

World Patient Safety Day is one of WHO's global public health days established in 2019 by World Health Assembly through resolution WHA72.6 – "Global action on patient safety". Its objectives are to increase public awareness and engagement, enhance global understanding, and work towards global solidarity and action by Member States to promote patient safety.

Each year, a new theme is selected to highlight a priority patient safety area for action. Ensuring safe care for patients is a fundamental priority, yet newborns and children remain especially vulnerable to patient safety risks. To bring attention to this critical issue, 'Safe care for every newborn and every child' has been selected as the theme for World Patient Safety Day (WPSD) 2025. It also aligns with global efforts such as the 'Every Woman, Every Newborn, Everywhere Action Plan', the 'Child Survival Action Initiative' and the 'Global Strategy for Women's, Children's and Adolescents' Health 2016-2030'. Under the slogan 'Patient safety from the start!'. WHO calls for urgent action to eliminate avoidable harm in pediatric and newborn care.

Objectives of World Patient Safety Day 2025

- 1. Raise global awareness of safety risks in pediatric and newborn care in all health care settings, emphasizing the specific needs of children, families and caregivers.
- 2. Mobilize governments, health care organizations, professional bodies and civil society to implement sustainable strategies, for safer care for newborns and children as part of broader patient safety and quality initiatives.
- 3. Empower parents, caregivers and children in patient safety by promoting education, awareness and active participation in care.
